Days One and Two feature **Policy Panels**, the first of these focuses on the **Doha Round of WTO talks** and the second on **Regional Integration in the Americas**. These panels are designed to stimulate discussion regarding contemporary policy issues, providing participants with insights into the policy process as well as guidance regarding the types of analysis would be most useful in future studies.

There are also more than 150 contributed papers being presented at this conference. They are organized along the lines of the overall conference themes, and reviewers have selected several papers on each topic to be **featured in special sessions**. These will be held in the auditorium and they have been allocated additional time. The conference organizing committee also put together a series of <u>special sessions</u>, based on the contributed papers. These, too, have been highlighted in the program.
