Figure 9: Summary of Conference Participants by GTAP Economic Classification

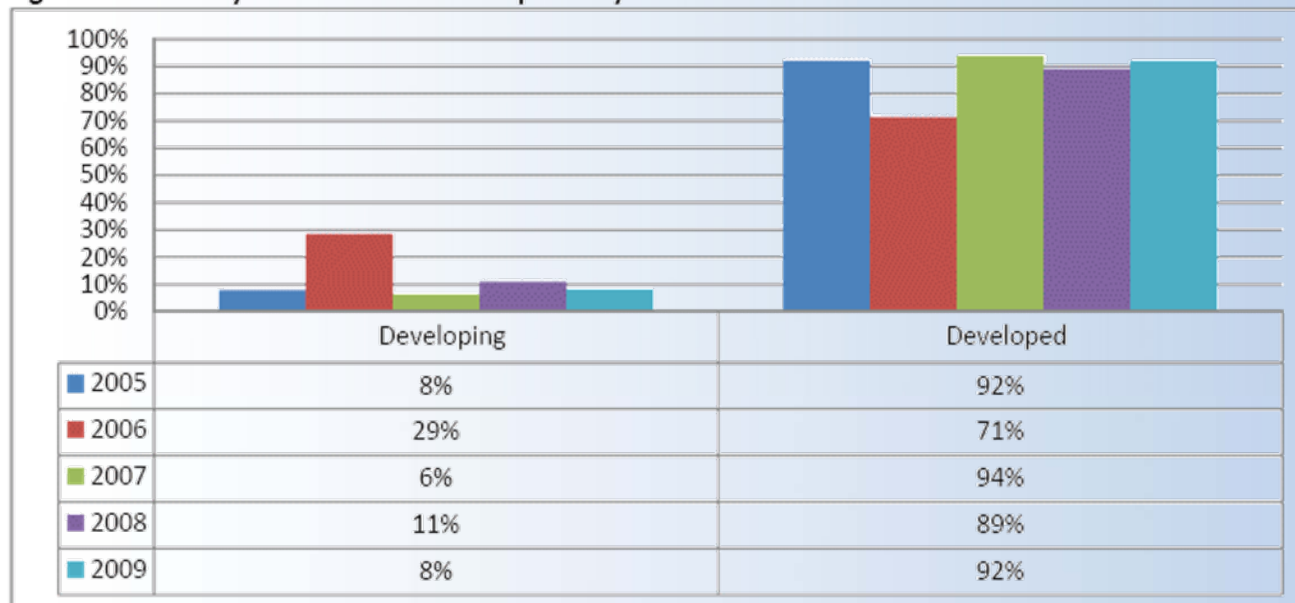


Figure 10: Summary of Conference Participants by Region

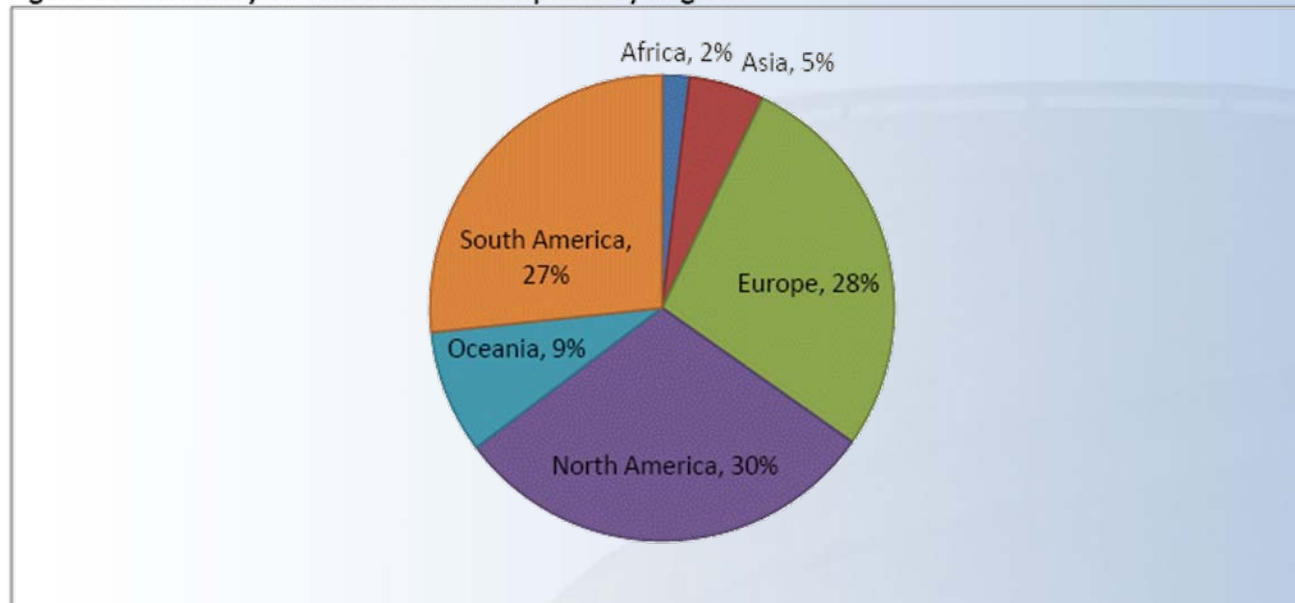
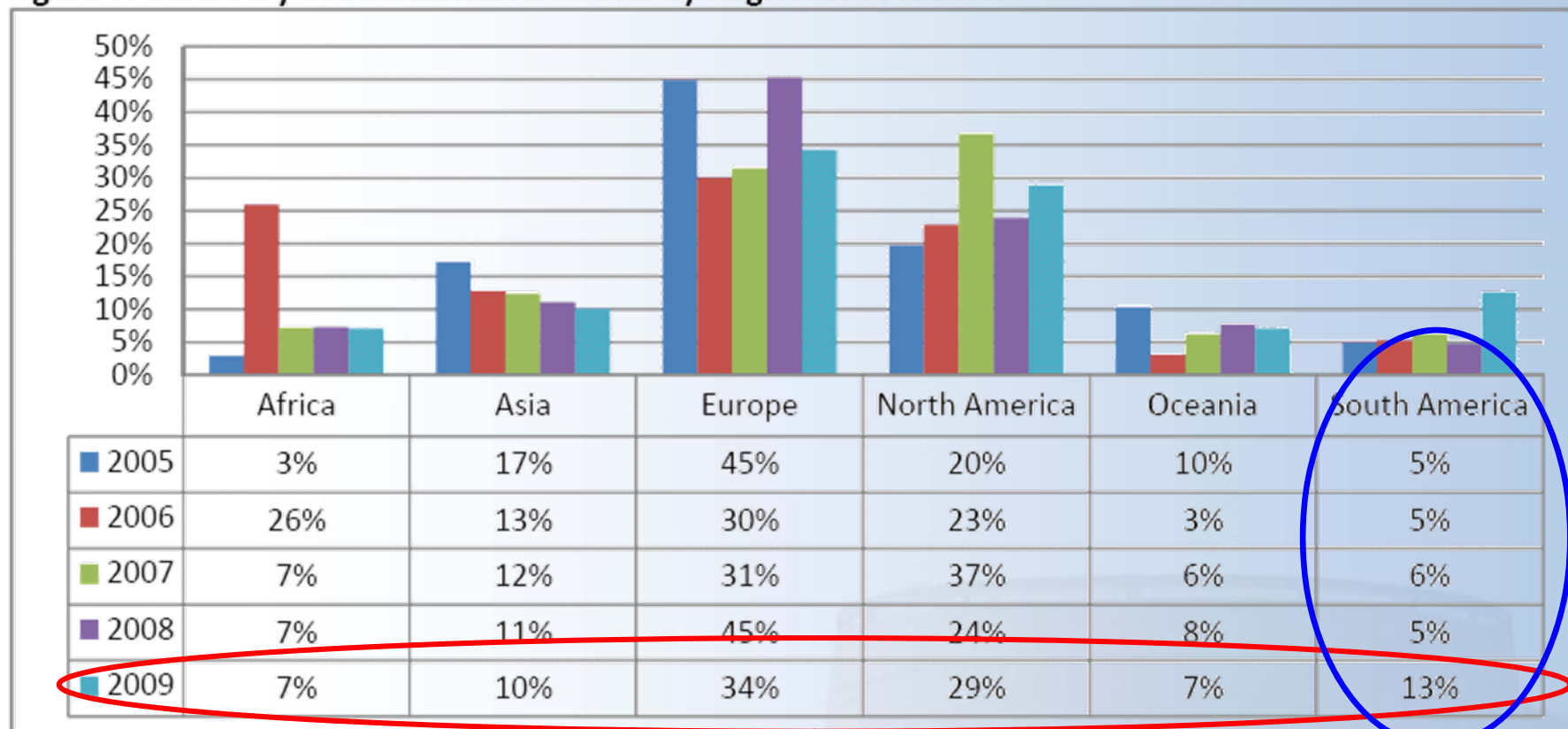


Figure 3: Summary of Submitted Abstracts by Region of Presenter

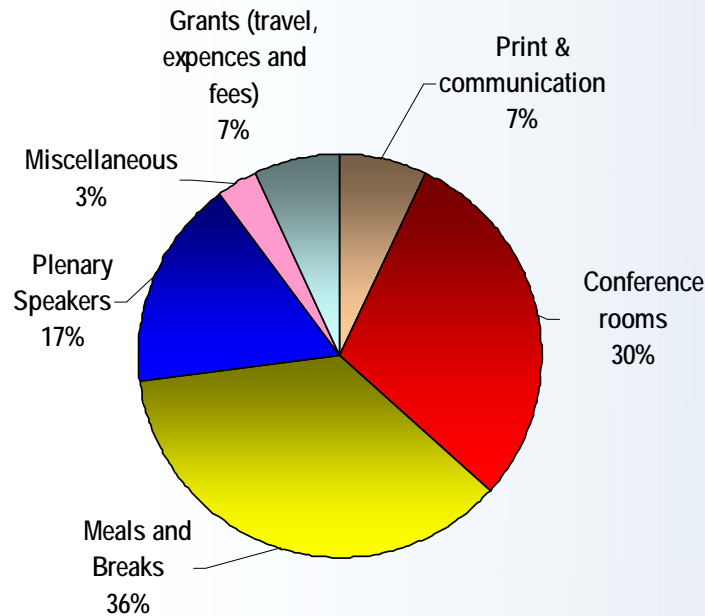

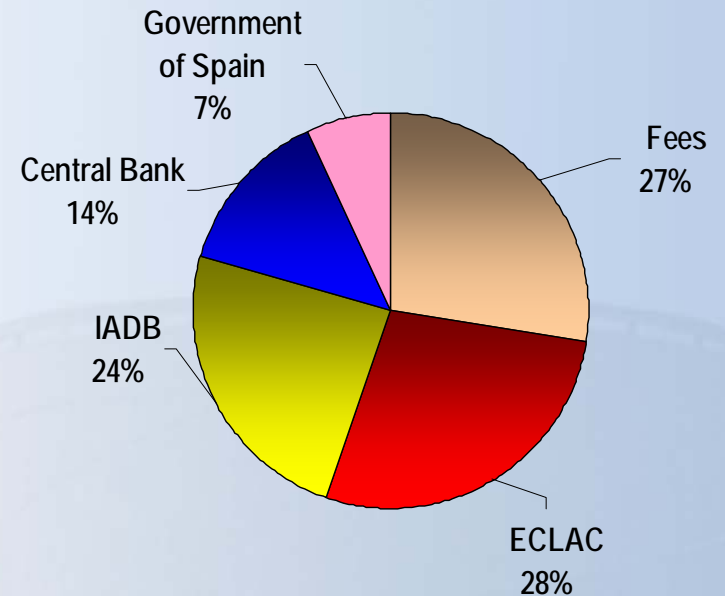


Final Budget
