## Overview of GTAP Africa Project

- Funding: Bank Netherlands Partnership Program via European Commission & World Bank
- Identifying 5 African economists: scholarships to contribute data and conduct research
- Training: GTAP short course and IO Table contribution course (August 2007)
- Collecting data on IO tables and international trade to build GTAP Africa Data Base

## Overview of GTAP Africa Project

- Seeking comments on the data from:
  - Representatives of GTAP consortium Board Members
  - Reviewers for individual IO tables (2 for each region) and for the whole database
- Research on African issues by the selected economists
- 2 Special sessions at 11<sup>th</sup> Annual GTAP Conference, Helsinki (June 2008)
- Public Release of GTAP Africa Data Base after incorporating all comments (December 2008)

# Overview of GTAP Africa Data Base

- 39 Regions: 30 African and 9 other regions
- New African regions:
  - Cameroon
  - Cote d'Ivoire
  - Democratic Republic of Congo
  - Ethiopia
  - Ghana
  - Kenya
  - Sudan.
- Other I-O tables and protection data: from GTAP v6.2 Data Base
- Improvements in international trade data

Most of the new tables are very recent and detailed!

#### **International Trade**

- There are numerous potentially non-zero intra-African bi-lateral trade flows missing due to the poor quality of trade data in many African countries: About 55% of the total number of transactions are missing!
- Nelson Villoria and Thomas Hertel have estimated these missing trade flows using gravity model and sample selection.

# GTAP Africa Project Phase II: A Proposal

- Identify mentors from the GTAP network and African economists for data, modeling and research that are specific to African regions
- Capacity Building: Two Africa short courses
- Data improvements: new regions (Algeria, Angola, Libya, Niger, etc.), poverty data, improvements in protection data, factor shares, skill shares, etc.
- Greater focus on modeling and research issues.
