#### **Developing Country Pricing**

- Changing the pricing of our different products and activities to encourage greater developing country participation is part of our strategic plan.
- At present, we offer a 50% data base discount to low income developing countries only.
- Much of the developing country interest in GTAP is from the low-middle income group of countries.
- We propose a 3 tier pricing scheme with a 40% discount for LM income LDCs and 60% for low income countries.

# Developing Country Data Base Pricing

- The discounts would not apply to purchases made with multi-lateral or bi-lateral funds the purpose is to permit income constrained developing country organizations and individuals to participate.
- We believe that the impacts on data base revenue will be minimal

# **Developing Country Short Course Pricing**

- Changing the pricing of the short-course is quite a different issue
  - While the marginal cost of an additional data base sale is quite low, that is not the case for a seat at a short-course
  - Even if we provided a discount for the course fee,
     LDC participants would still have to pay travel, so most would still be excluded
- We prefer to seek external funding to pay for increased developing country short-course participation – will need board member help

## **Developing Country Conference Pricing**

- Conference pricing is somewhere in between data base and short-course
  - Travel is still an issue
  - But the marginal cost of an additional participant is relatively low
- We need to seek external funding from donor agencies to fund participation
- We also should provide developing country registrants the same fee as students, which should be designed to cover variable costs
