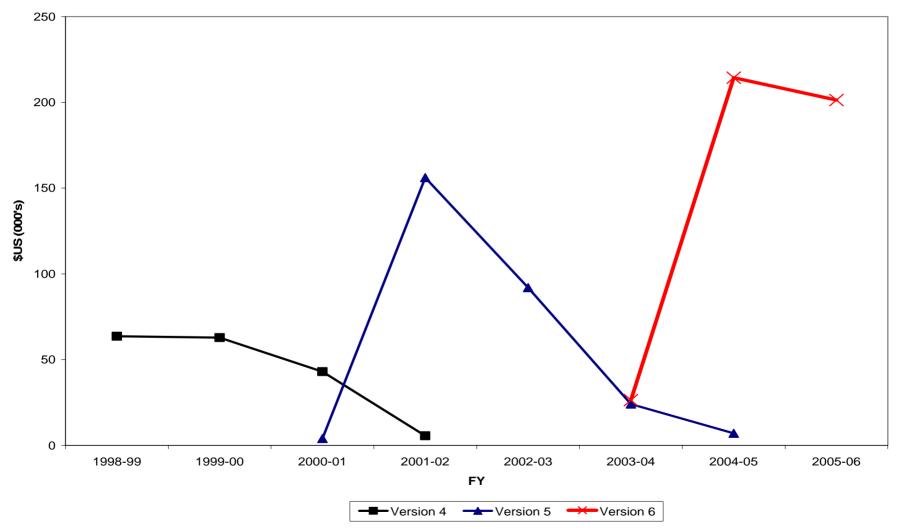
- Running a deficit of \$49K

 - Other goals set out in 2004 Strategic plan, e.g., multiple years.

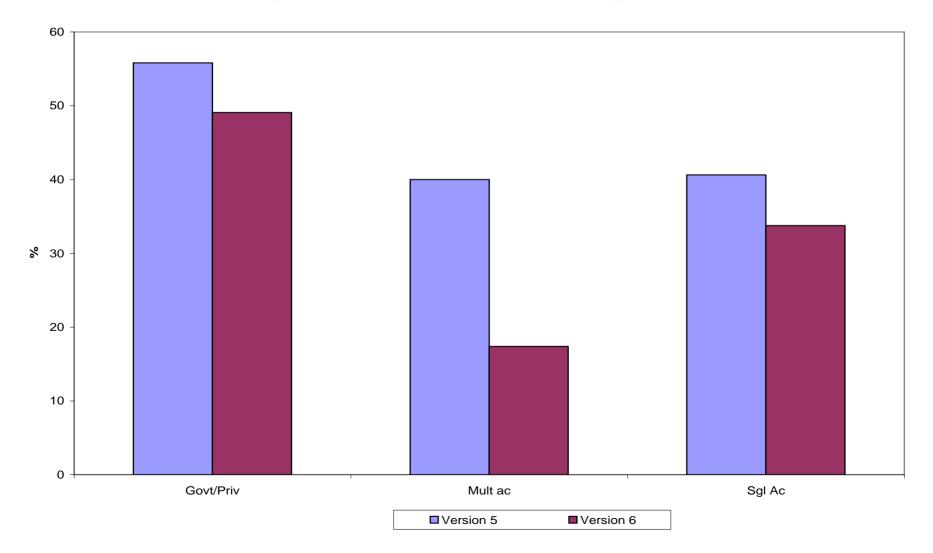

Sales to Low Income countries have increased with more recent versions

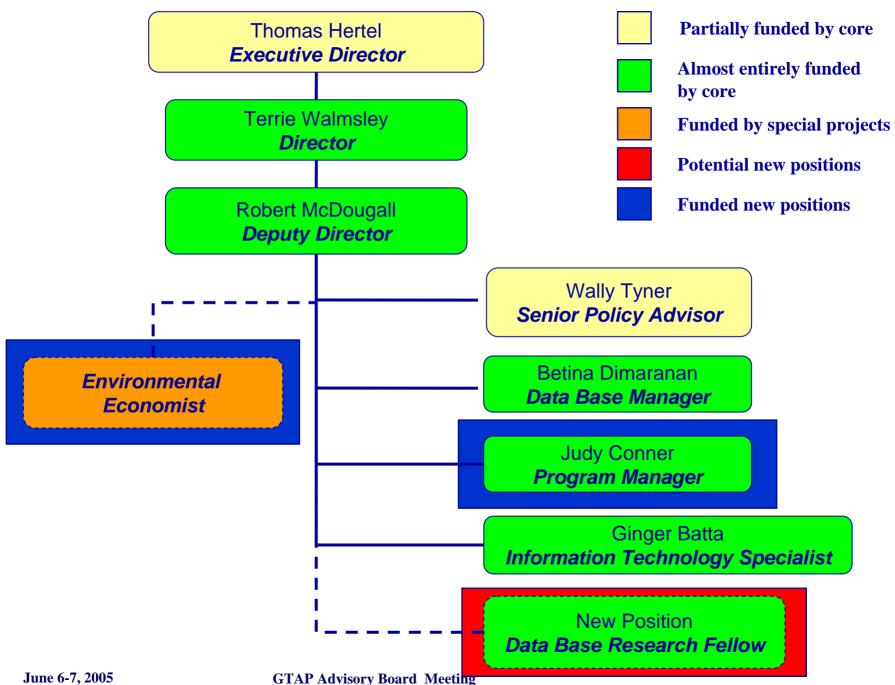

Future of GTAP

- Demand for more and better data is going to continue.
 - increased scope e.g., taxes and services;
 - more countries;
 - additional processing of data for improving quality; and
 - other goals set out in 2004 Strategic plan, e.g., multiple years.
- As a result:
 - More pre-processing is being required in-house:
 - as more new data sets are gathered to expand the scope of the GTAP Data Base; and
 - with the emphasis on quality more checks are undertaken on incoming data.
 - More scope means building more modules to combine alternative data sources and fill in missing numbers.
 - More low-quality countries means more potential for problems in the construction process.
- Overall the skills required to do the job have increased: Graduate students are less prepared.

New Appointments: Environmental Economist

- Description of role
 - This person will assist with current EPA projects and build their own research agenda in Environmental Economics using the GTAP framework.
 - Funds secured from special projects
- Current Status
 - March-May 2006, Interviewed 3 candidates for Research Faculty Position
 - Short term: Hiring a post-doc to focus on immediate needs.
 - Future: Research Faculty Position not ruled out.

New Appointments: Program Manager

- Description of role
 - This person will manage the GTAP Programs, oversee the GTAP finances, communicate with board and network members and oversee marketing efforts.
 - Funded from core data
- Current Status
 - Advertising position
 - New person required mid- to end- of July

Potential New Appointment: Data Base Research Fellow

- **Description of role**
 - Will assist with the production of the GTAP Data Base, including special topics to extend the data base (e.g., Taxes), and with special releases.
 - Looking for some with a Masters degree plus experience with large datasets.
- Current Status
 - Funding required

Even without hiring an extra person to achieve goals, CGTA will run a deficit at current consortium levels

In order to fund one extra staff member and breakeven \$102K is required

- \$US102K is required to fund new staff member (\$US70K) and breakeven (\$US32K).
- This can be obtained from a variety of sources:
 - Consortium (\$US60K)
 - Increase to \$20K (Last increased 1999)
 - Alternative sources
 - Special releases
 - More Special Projects
 - More consortium members

Increased consortium fees contribute \$30K towards new staff member.
