The Research Institute of Economy, Trade and Industry (RIETI) was established in April 2001 upon the foundations laid by its forerunner, the Ministry of International Trade and Industry/Research Institute (MITI/RI) as a policy research institute with a certain degree of independence from the administrative authorities to carry out study, analysis and research on various policy issues at an internationally reputable level from a medium- to long-term perspective. RIETI contributes to policy debates and formulation through the built-in synergy in its research and its proactive dissemination of its research, leading to policy recommendations.

The GTAP model simulation studies have been utilized to analyze the impacts of several structural policy measures like trade and investment liberalization, climate change and economic development. In particular, it has occasionally contributed to the studies analyzing the impacts of the Japan's bilateral Free Trade Agreements (FTAs) and Regional Trade Agreements (RTAs) in policy arena.
